READ READ READ READ

- Read to your child daily, if only for a few minutes.
- Choose nursery rhymes, folk and fairy tales, and modern children's classics. The children's department of the public library can furnish a recommended list. Picture books are best for the very young. As a child gets older, start reading longer books, one chapter at a time.
- Share your own childhood favorites; the experience will have more meaning if you enjoy it too.
- When you read, keep it cozy. Hold the book with one hand and cuddle your child with the other.
- Be prepared to read the same story over and over. Children learn from repetition.
- Read with expression and pay attention to punctuation.
- As you read, take a little time to point out letters and words and talk about their meaning.
